



July 2024-June 2025 (96) Total Books Sold)




Book Sales Per Year

Participants are asked to create something construction-related without adult help or guidance using approved materials.




Design Drafting

The Design Drafting Competition is a contest designed to expose High School and College-level students to design drawing and the construction industry. The contest recognizes students for creative design, successful problem-solving, and craftsmanship in preparing architectural drawings. Entries are evaluated for detail, accuracy, and originality of work. The objectives of the contest are to introduce the student to the construction industry in a positive and challenging manner while fostering a sense of self-worth and building confidence.
